What is College Credit Plus?

- ❖ Opportunity to take college courses while in high school
- ❖ College-ready, eligible students in Grades 7-12
- ❖ Earn both high school credit & college credit

Student Benefits

- ❖ Earn high school & college credit for your classes
- ❖ Courses appear on high school & college transcripts
- ❖ Reduce the time and cost to earning college credit
- ❖ Easy transfer of college credit
- ❖ Take college courses in familiar settings
- ❖ Get a head start on a college degree
- ❖ Gain exposure to college-level coursework while in high school

General Information

- ❖ High schools must provide two pathways for students to earn college credit
 - 15 hour pathway
 - 30 hour pathway
- ❖ Students must meet college admission requirements
- ❖ Course will be the same course as at the college campus
- ❖ 3 Semester Hours = 1 HS credit
 - 4 semester hours = 1.33 HS credits
 - 5 semester hours = 1.66 HS credits
- ❖ Maximum of 10 HS credits per academic year
 - 30 college credit hours
- ❖ Weighted Grades
 - AP weight for courses in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies

Financial Information and Costs

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

- ❖ Tuition
 - \$40- \$160 per credit hour
- ❖ Class Fees
- ❖ Textbooks

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

- ❖ Transportation
- ❖ Parking
- ❖ If the student receives a failing grade at the end of the college course or drops the college course after the drop date, the district may seek reimbursement for tuition, fees, and textbooks

Possible CCP Course Formats

- ❖ On the high school campus
 - Taught by a qualified high school teacher
 - Co-taught by a high school teacher & a college instructor
 - Online college course taught by a college instructor and proctored by a high school teacher
- ❖ On the college campus, taught by college instructor
- ❖ Online college course after school hours

MHS Implementation

- ❖ Wright State University
 - 4 courses at MHS taught by an MHS teacher
- ❖ Sinclair Community College
 - 7 online courses build into schedule at MHS
- ❖ Required pathways
- ❖ Students may attend courses on college campuses

College Readiness

- ❖ Grades 7-12
- ❖ College-Level Courses
- ❖ Determined by College/University
 - Admission Requirements
 - ACT Score or Placement Test Scores
 - Course Prerequisites
 - Recommendation from High School

Student Process

- ❖ Turn in Letter of Intent During Scheduling
- ❖ Course Selection with HS Counselor
- ❖ Complete College Credit Plus Application
 - ACT/SAT Scores
 - High School Transcript
 - Recommendation
- ❖ Take Placement Tests (if applicable)
 - Sinclair Accuplacer: February 24th and 25th
 - WSU Writing: February 29th
 - WSU Math: March 8th
